There are three divisions to the property tax paid in Waterloo. Fifty-one percent will be paid to the region, 31 percent are municipal taxes, and the final 18 percent goes to the school districts. TRANSPORTATION

The opportunities for getting around Waterloo include: bus, bicycle, motor vehicle, light rail transit, and trails.



<u>Buses</u> are operated by <u>Grand River Transit</u>, also known as GRT. A specialized transit vehicle for persons with disabilities is also operated by GRT, and it is called <u>MobilityPLUS</u>.

The nearest GO Transit railway station is Kitchener GO Station. As well, Waterloo also has bus service to the University of Waterloo, Wilfrid Laurier University, Square One City Centre Terminal, and the Milton GO Station.

Cycling, or bicycling, is greatly encouraged throughout Waterloo's communities. They received an award in 2011 from the "Share the Road Cycling Coalition" for the work they have done with bike paths in the region. A number of cycling-related programs are offered, including CAN-BIKE, Travelwise, and the Blue W program.

Rail Travel

The Kitchener railway station is located just southeast of uptown Waterloo. The Kitchener station is served by six trains daily serving from London, Ontario to Toronto.
